Maine South is pleased to recognize Caleigh Pistorius as one of 207's Best in the area of Extra Curricular

Caleigh Pistorius is one of the most decorated athletes in the history of Maine South. When Caleigh was only a few days old, she was brought into a gymnastics gym and has been competing ever since. She grew up with two loving parents who were also great coaches. In athletics, she has always had great relationships with her teammates and coaches, both at school and in club gymnastics. Her relationship with her parents is very close as well because both of her parents are athletes and supportive of her student-athlete lifestyle. Her mother is a gymnastics coach and has always been able to give advice and offer suggestions. Her father is always cheering her on and has grown his knowledge of gymnastics because he's seen her compete so many times. Freshman year she was out for the majority of the season but she still qualified for state, finishing twelfth overall. She qualified for state finals in vault, beam, and floor during sophomore year and won the state title in balance beam. Junior year, the team made it to state as a team for the first time in school history. She made it to finals in vault, bars, and floor and placed fifth in bars. Senior year, the team made it state again, finishing third overall and she placed fourth in vault, and placed second all-around in both her junior and senior year. Caleigh is also a dedicated student in other areas of Maine South. She was in DECA freshman year, she's a member of Italian club, NHS, and volunteers for the differently-abled at MWSRA in their athletic program where she is an athletic coach on Saturday mornings. She is devoted to her academic studies as well, taking coursework such as AP Psych, APUSH, AP Calc A/B and AP Italian. Finally, she is a member of the state champion C-Team as a member of unit six.

Caleigh's Intro to Business teacher, Mrs Amy Kladis, says, "Caleigh is a true example of a student athlete. The amount of time it takes to perform at the elite level for gymnastics is unknown to most, but it is A LOT! Caleigh knows that her first priority is her academics, though. On top of hours of daily practice, she then puts in equal effort making sure that she is prepared for school. She is a wonderful role model to young gymnasts and her peers and is a great ambassador of Maine South at her competitions."

Caleigh was the IHSA Balance Beam State Champion in 2017, her sophomore year, and placed second in the IHSA State All-Around

competition both in 2018 and 2019. Caleigh truly encapsulates what it means to be a successful student, athlete and person. In the challenging setting of balancing both academics and athletics, Caleigh distinguished herself as one of the most dedicated student athletes I have encountered during my career. After an injury that could have ended most athletes career, Caleigh pushed forward, worked hard, made adjustments, lead her team back down state and once again ranked in the top of the State of Illinois for girls gymnastics. It is a big accomplishment to make it down state as an athlete once in your high school career, but to make it to the top level all four years is so incredible, actually breathtaking. Caleigh is the definition of perseverance and hard work. She is an outstanding individual and student-athlete and deserves every bit of the recognition that goes with this award. She has helped put Maine South Girls gymnastics on the map and a team to be reckoned with. She has forever made her mark on her sport. This openness to all people was also evident in our class workshops on one another's writing and opinion analysis. In addition to her compassion, her sense of humor makes her an asset to any group. Added to all of this is a top state athlete, a family woman, and an asset to our community."

Outside of the classroom and the extra curricular activities that she is involved in, Caleigh is a role model to my young daughter, Ellie, who is 7. She is genuine, enthusiastic, and always goes "all in". Caleigh will attend the University of Dayton in the honors college and major in criminal justice with a minor in Italian and she wants to be a criminal justice attorney.
