Dr. Bonuma earned her bachelor of arts degree from University of Dubuque with a triple major in Marketing, International Studies and Spanish.

She earned her masters in Secondary Education with a Type 09 certificate in Spanish, Business and Social Studies from Roosevelt University. She earned her Ed.D. Educational Administration degree with a Superintendent Endorsement from Aurora University.

Questions & Answers with New Superintendent Dr. Tatiana Bonuma

Why did you go into the field of education?

I initially went into education because of an experience I had in high school. I had a group of teachers that knew exactly how to channel my energy and passion for learning. I was entrusted to support my peers who struggled in math and science courses. I learned through this experience how much I enjoyed helping others reach their goals and gain confidence. What is your motivation for becoming a superintendent?

What are your core beliefs about education?



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


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Several Honored by State Board of Education
