1. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

President Yousuf-Abramson called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, the Board Secretary called the roll.

2. COMMUNICATIONS

A. Update from Superintendent

1. Student Recognition - Spotlight Awards

Dr. Bonuma introduced a new award in District 207 that honors students throughout our District who may not be in the traditional spotlight but shine in their own way. Some of the students who will be honored have persevered against difficult odds, have turned their work around at school, or are non-traditional or quiet leaders. Dr. Bonuma introduced Maine East Principal Dr. Pikul, who announced the names of the following students from East; Anthea Arianna Almero, Yasmeen Ashiq, Miguel De Loyola, Ryan Gonzalez (Ray), Jonathan Huerta, Jaden Nieto, Sereen Adel Tamimi and Jaden Woodfork. Dr. Pikul introduced Mr. Jake Nesler, teacher at Frost Academy. Mr. Nesler acknowledged Sal Arroyo and Caden (CJ) Bailey. Mr. Nesler introduced Maine South Principal Dr. Babakhani. Dr. Babakhani introduced Dean Arvanitis, Alex Carlos, Grace Cioromski, Aristeia Kostarelou, James Lee, Maja Matic, Brinley Moran and Maria Stamenova. Dr. Babakhani introduced Dr. Eileen McMahan, Maine West Principal. Dr. McMahan announced the names of the Maine West students being honored and included; Milo Foy, Camila Herrera, Caylem Hubbard, Yulianna Humeniak, Teegan MacDonald, Nguyen "Nicky" Pham, Devin Renteria and Natalie Valdez. The Board of Education applauded the students and shook all of their hands. Dr. Bonuma congratulated all of the honorees and asked the students to stay for photos following all of the student awards.

2. Student Recognition - Extracurricular Activities

Dr. Bonuma went on to introduce Maine West Fine Arts Department Chair Ms. Jennifer Mullen. Ms. Mullen explained the ACT-So Fine Arts Regional and National Awards and introduced Health Programming Coordinator Ms. Tigelique Woods. Ms Woods shared the names of the student honorees for the ACT-So Fine awards including; Ashley Ankum, Savanna Brown, Tohi Ezeocha and Madison Thames. Ms. Mullen then welcomed CTE Department Chair Mr. Greg Reichelt who explained the DECA program. Mr. Reichelt introduced Fine Arts Department Chair Dr. Teralyn Keith. Dr. Keith invited Fine Arts Teacher Ms. Rebecca Fisher to announce names of the IHSA Student Film Competition award recipients. Next, CTE Department Chair Ms. Sabrina Benjamin explained the HOSA program. Dr. Bonuma congratulated all of the students and their families on these honors and invited all students to have their photos taken.

3. National Teacher Appreciation Week - May 4-8, 2026

On behalf of the Board of Education, Dr. Bonuma recognized all teachers during Teacher Appreciation week, expressing sincere appreciation for their work each and every day. Dr. Bonuma thanked teachers for their resilience in showing up for their students and added that the District is here to support them, champion their growth, and ensure they have what they need to continue this vital work.

B. Strategic Plan Presentation

Dr. Bonuma stated the strategic plan has been a year long process for the team. The planning portion was launched in spring 2025 with the plan of hearing from all stakeholders while centering around the same goals of creating a safe and enriching environment for students to feel seen and heard. Teacher Danny Walzer explained that the 5-year plan was developed through an interactive process with stakeholder input and included over forty focus groups, 1800 survey responses and a fifty person committee of students, parents/guardians, Board members, teachers, staff, school and District administrators, community members and business partners. Next, students Emma and Ayesha shared details of the plan, the vision, "Portrait of a Graduate", and how we will support all students to learn, grow and thrive.

Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Innovation Dr. Shawn Messmer laid out Goal 1 focusing on learning in a school setting with rigorous, relevant and engaging learning, as well as a shared and collaborative curriculum. Success will be measured in overall performance on reading and math benchmarks, students reporting favorably on climate surveys, and an increase in classrooms using high-impact universal Tier 1 practices.

Assistant Superintendent for Student and Family Services Ms. Katie Di Sanza presented Goals 2 and 3. Goal 2 ensures access and opportunity for all students through partnership with families, hearing student voices, identifying student needs, providing interventions and monitoring impact. Success will be measured by increases in performance on reading and math benchmarks, student subgroups (ML learners and students with IEPs) achieving benchmarks on the DLM or ACT assessment, and increase of enrollment in courses advancing students to the next level of rigor. Goal 3 is commitment to building connections so students feel known, valued, heard, and prepared for post graduation success. Success metrics include favorable responses to climate surveys indicating a sense of belonging, favorable responses of current students, families and alumni of the

post-secondary advising and support, increasing District wide attendance, and ensuring each graduate possesses a post-secondary plan for success.

Director of Communications Mr. Brett Clark finished up with Goal 4 which ensures the District provides clear communication and ongoing engagement with all stakeholders. Staff have experienced uneven access to data related to priorities, roles and decision making. This goal will provide clarity and transparency for educators and stakeholders. Success will be measured in staff reporting consistency in District expectations, policies and roles, stakeholders reporting improved communication, and staff reporting higher level of access to reliable and available data, shared understanding, and decision making.

Dr. Bonuma added that all goals are interconnected and support each other. President Yousuf-Abramson appreciates the 2-way communication and thanked the team for all of the work on this, especially the students here tonight.

Member Heneghan noted she toured Maine South to view some roof leaks and the plan to fix them and appreciates getting the information to teachers and community members.
